# Wahlert Counseling News Corner:

#### **ACT District Exam Hosted at Wahlert | Juniors & Seniors**

Fall ACT District Exam Tuesday, October 6th

**Click here**\_for an overview of what your student can expect on the October 6th ACT test day.

<u>Registration Deadline</u>: September 25, 2020 | Registration Closed <u>Fall exam available for</u>: Wahlert juniors and seniors only.

In an effort to ensure that every Wahlert junior and senior has an opportunity to take the ACT exam this fall, Wahlert is now a district testing site for the fall ACT exam (with writing). This means that Wahlert will administer the ACT exam (with writing) during the school day and at Wahlert on Tuesday, October 6, for juniors and seniors who are registered to participate in this particular exam.

• Registration for the October 6th ACT exam at Wahlert is not completed online - students are to drop off their exam payment directly to the Guidance Office by September 25th to register. There is no online registration component at all with ACT for district exam registration - payment is instead to be handed in directly to Wahlert's Guidance Office. We have reserved tests for all juniors and seniors to take the October 6th exam, so students do not need to worry about registration being a first-come-first-serve basis. However, payment is due no later than Friday, September 25, to the Guidance Office as we try to limit classroom sizes due to COVID-19. Wahlert is only offering the ACT exam with writing for the October district exam. Students should expect to participate in and be prepared

to take the ACT with writing on October 6. However, if a student prefers not to take the writing portion of the ACT exam (they've taken it before, their college/university doesn't require it, etc.), they can opt out of that particular portion of the exam on October 6th during test day.

• The cost to take the ACT exam (with writing) in October is \$59.50 per student. Checks can be made payable to Wahlert Catholic High School and must be turned in to Wahlert's Counseling Office no later than Friday, September 25th.

#### PSAT Exam Hosted at Wahlert | Sophomores & Juniors

PSAT Exam Wahlert Catholic High School Wednesday, October 14

Registration Deadline: October 7th

<u>Exam fee</u>: \$17 (payments to be submitted electronically using e-Funds - see below for more details)

- What: The PSAT/NMSQT (Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test) national exam
- When: 7:40 a.m. on Wednesday, October 14, 2020
- Where: <u>Juniors</u> registered for the PSAT will take the exam on campus in Wahlert Catholic High School's O'Connor Athletic Center (OAC) located in the lower level of the high school near the athletic training room. <u>Sophomores</u> registered for the PSAT will take the exam on campus in Wahlert Catholic High School's gymnasium located on the first floor of the high school near the athletic offices.
- Why: The PSAT/NMSQT is a great practice test for taking the SAT. As juniors, students can qualify for the National Merit

Scholarship Program. The test also gives students insight into which AP courses they may be ready to take. Although sophomores cannot qualify for the National Merit Competition, they can essentially take a "practice" PSAT to be better prepared for the PSAT and SAT junior year. The test also gives students insight into which AP courses they may be ready to take.

We strongly recommend sophomores who typically score in the 90<sup>th</sup> percentile or above on standardized tests, and/or are planning to take the SAT, to sign up for the PSAT. Not all sophomores are required or recommended to take the PSAT exam.

#### **Exam Cost**

The fee to take the PSAT is \$17 per exam, due no later than Wednesday, October 7th. New this year! Payments for the PSAT exam are to be submitted using your Holy Family e-Funds account. Click here to log in to your e-Funds account, select or add your student, select "Pay for Optional Fees", and select "PSAT Exam" to submit payment. Click here for a step-by-step guide to using e-Funds if this is a new program for your family. All payments for PSAT exams are to be submitted electronically using e-Funds no later than Wednesday, October 7th. Wahlert has a limited amount of PSAT exams, so please reserve your student's exam soon! Your payment alone solidifies your student's spot on exam day - no additional registration steps are required.

Remind your child... He/she will receive a PSAT Student Guide from Wahlert Catholic High School's Counseling Office upon payment of the exam. Please have your child stop by the Counseling Office to pick up this guide after you submitted your online payment. This guide provides sample questions and test taking tips along with an explanation of the National Merit Competition.

#### **October Tips**

- Know the priority dates for filing the FAFSA at the colleges your student is applying to. Submit your student's completed FAFSA after Oct. 1 but before the priority date. ICAN can help (877) 272-4692.
- Students are encouraged to talk to admission counselors at the colleges they're applying to and find out whether retaking the <u>ACT</u> or <u>SAT</u> would be advantageous.
- Students are encouraged to submit their admission applications to the colleges they're most interested in. Be aware of deadlines! Try to have applications submitted by Nov. 1.
- Obtain financial aid forms from colleges that require forms other than the FAFSA.

October is just around the corner! The beginning of October marks the time period that parents should be thinking about and working on the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). This form is used to apply for federal student aid such as loans, grants, and work-study at both two-year colleges as well as four-year colleges. The FAFSA is the first step to receiving financial aid and must be completed for each year of college. Students can use the myStudentAid app, file online

at **fafsa.edu.gov**, or request a printed form by calling 1-800-4-FEDAID. This form is very important for you and your child to complete together so that your child is able to receive student financial assistance.
