NICC College Course Fees Due | November 24

Parents of students who are currently enrolled in college courses through Northeast Iowa Community College (College Writing, Public Speaking, College Probability/Statistics, etc.) received an email on Thursday, November 5th regarding how to submit payment for their student's NICC courses by Tuesday, November 24.

Course Payment Deadline

- Tuesday, November 24.
- Payments are to be submitted electronically via your family's e-Funds account. More details on accessing and submitting e-Funds payment is listed below.

How do I submit payment for my student's college course(s)?

New this year! Payments for college course fees are to be submitted using your Holy Family e-Funds account. [Click here](#) to log in to your family's e-

Funds account, select or add your student, select “Pay Student Fees”, and submit payment for the college courses listed. [Click here](#) for a step-by-step guide to using e-Funds if this is a new program for your family. All payments for your student’s college credit courses are to be submitted electronically using e-Funds no later than Tuesday, November 24. Please ensure that the college course fees listed in your family’s e-Funds account are correct - if you notice a course is incorrectly listed, or missing, please contact dlensen@holymfamilydbq.org.

Your Student's District ACT Exam Score Availability

If your junior or senior student completed the District ACT exam at Wahlert Catholic High School on Tuesday, October 6th, your student's test score will be available no earlier than 2-8 weeks after exam day. If your student completed the make-up ACT exam at Wahlert on Tuesday, October 20, your student's test score will be available no earlier than 2-8 weeks after that specific exam day.

Students who have taken the ACT exam before will not be notified via email or mail when their scores are available - instead, students will need to log on to their [MyACT account](#) to check in and view their scores.

If the recent district ACT exam was your student's first time taking the ACT, your student will be mailed their ACT score report in the coming weeks, and will not be able to access their score online via MyACT (this is because your student does not yet have an ACT ID to do so).

If your student has taken the ACT exam before and does not have a MyACT account, please visit MyACT's website to create one. Once you visit the [MyACT landing page](#), there are three blue link buttons located under the "Welcome to MyACT" header - select the one that correctly identifies your student's scenario, and follow the prompts to create an account for your student.

Your student's ACT ID information...

If your student has taken the ACT exam before - take a look at their previous score reports from ACT. In the upper left corner area of their score report, you'll see their ACT ID listed. If they don't have a previous score report, they can stop by Wahlert's Guidance Office. We also have a copy and can give them their ACT ID information.

If this was the first time your student has taken the ACT exam - first time ACT examinees WILL be mailed their score reports from the recent district ACT exam. As a result, your student won't be able to access their ACT score directly online this time around since they don't yet have an ACT ID. Scores will be mailed out to those examinees in the coming weeks.

YAPPERS Accepting New Members | Dubuque Youth Area Philanthropists

Dubuque's Youth Area Philanthropists (YAPPERS) are the youth board of the Community Foundation of Greater Dubuque. This diverse group of high school students use volunteerism, grantmaking, and philanthropy to develop leadership skills, act as positive youth role models, and improve the Dubuque community. The YAPPERS program gives young people a voice in the issues that affect them now, and the skills to confront the challenges they will face in the future. The best way to learn generosity, gain leadership skills, and value community service is by direct exposure and involvement.

The YAPPERS consist of students from Hempstead, Dubuque Senior, and Wahlert high schools who work to address the needs of youth in the Greater Dubuque area. Their energy and focus are directed on two major projects/areas: a full grantmaking cycle and Dubuque's Feed the Need event. The grants are issued to local nonprofit organizations that conduct programs which serve Dubuque youth.

YAPPERS members meet monthly to engage in teambuilding and leadership activities, to discuss local youth issues, and to plan events in the community. Additionally, the council conducts community service projects.

Members are expected to...

- Attend monthly meetings from August-May
- Learn about youth needs and assets in our community
- Make decisions about granting funds to youth projects
- Work with adults and show adults that youth are a community resource
- Participate in community service projects
- Are open to opportunities for personal growth (i.e. leadership skills)
- Make a difference in our community

High School Oratorical Contest | American Legion, Post 6

Dubuque's American Legion (Post 6) invites students, grades 9th-12th, to participate in this year's High School Oratorical Contest. The American Legion's annual oratorical contest is an opportunity for students to develop a deeper knowledge and appreciation of the Constitution of the United States. Other objectives of the contest include the development of leadership qualities, the ability to think and speak clearly, and the preparation for acceptance of the duties and responsibilities, rights, and privileges of American citizenship.

Contest/Speech Details...

Students interested in participating must create a speech related to some aspect of the U.S. Constitution, such as the right to vote or any other amendment. Dubuque's local oratorical contest will be held on **Sunday, December 6th**. Prizes will be awarded for students who are selected as 1st place (\$100), 2nd place (\$75), and 3rd place (\$50). The first place winner will move on to the County Oratorical contest later in the month with similar prizes. The oration-speech must be the original preparation, research, and organizational effort of each contestant. Each contestants' speech needs to be at least 8 minutes long, but not exceeding 10 minutes. There will be point penalties if the speech is under or over time limit. At the county and local level, 3x5 cards with notes are allowed during the speech.

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) Available October 1

The beginning of October marks the time period that parents should be thinking about and working on the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). This form is used to apply for federal student aid such as loans, grants, and work-study at both two-year colleges as well as four-year colleges. The FAFSA is the first step to receiving financial aid and must be completed for each year of college. Students can use the myStudentAid app, file online at fafsa.edu.gov, or request a printed form by calling 1-800-4-FEDAID. This form is very important for you and your child to complete together so that your child is able to receive student financial assistance.
