Registration Now Open | ACT District Exam, March 2

In an effort to ensure that our sophomores, juniors, and seniors have an opportunity to take the ACT exam this academic year, Wahlert is now a district testing site for the spring ACT exam (with writing). This means that Wahlert will administer the ACT exam (with writing) during the school day at Wahlert on Tuesday, March 2, for our sophomores, juniors, and seniors who are interested in and registered for this particular exam.*

Spring ACT District Exam

Exam Day: Tuesday, March 2

Cost: \$59.50 per student

Registration Deadline: Monday, February 22

Who can take the exam? This exam is available to our sophomores, juniors, and seniors. (If you have questions about if your sophomore should take the ACT exam in March, please contact our school counselors at klenart@holyfamilydbq.org or dbuddebandy@holyfamilydbq.org.)

Please Note...

- **Registration for the March 2nd ACT exam at Wahlert is not completed on ACT's website.** Students are to submit their exam payment using their family's online Holy Family eFunds account by February 22nd to register. **Click here** to log in to your eFunds account, select or add your student, select "Pay for Optional Fees", and select "ACT

March 2, 2021” to submit payment. [Click here](#) for a step-by-step guide to using e-Funds if this is a new program for your family.

- **Families may submit payment via check if they prefer not to submit payment online.**
Checks may be made payable to Wahlert Catholic High School; please indicate in the memo portion of the check your student’s name and if they plan to take the writing portion of the exam on March 2).
- **Wahlert is only offering the ACT exam with writing for the March district exam. Students are encouraged to participate in writing portion of the exam; however, this is portion of the exam is optional.**
IMPORTANT: Parents/students are to indicate in the field provided on eFunds if their student plans to take/not take the writing portion of the exam. If your family is paying for this exam by check, please indicate this in the memo portion along with your student’s name.
- **We have reserved enough exams for our students to take on March 2nd, so students do not need to worry about registration being a first-come-first-serve basis.** However, payment is due no later than Monday, February 22, to the Guidance Office as we try to limit classroom sizes due to COVID-19.

- Learn tips to improve scores in all subtests.
- Practice strategies to eliminate wrong choices.
- Take short practice tests that mirror the real test experience.
- Reduce test anxiety and gain confidence.
- Receive extensive materials for home practice.

Certified Nurses Aide Course Opportunities | NICC Summer Courses

NICC is once again offering Certified Nurses Aide (CNA), Dosage Calculations, Medical Terminology, and Nutrition courses over the summer, free of cost. Students who participate are required to receive high school credit for coursework.

The following courses will be offered...

- **HSC: 172 Nurse Aide**
(Students must be 16 years of age by time of clinicals; background checks and TB tests required. Students are not responsible for the registration and materials cost.)
- **PNN: 200 Dosage Calculations** (Online)
- **PNN: 270 Intro to Nutrition** (Online)
- **HSC: 114 Medical Terminology** (Online)

How do I register my student for this opportunity?

In order to register, your student must complete [this interest survey](#) by February 12. From there, NICC will contact you with further information and steps. Course registration is not guaranteed, but NICC will do their best to secure placement for all students. Courses will run between June and August. Priority registration will be given based on survey completion date and time. The interest survey must be completed by February 12.

Northeast Iowa Career Learning Link (CLL) is a program through Northeast Iowa Community College (NICC) that exposes students to high-demand career areas and sets them on the pathway to career and educational success beyond high school. The program provides work-based learning opportunities for students in partnership with local businesses.

Double-check Your Student's AP Exam Order through AP Classroom

If you are a parent of a Wahlert student currently enrolled in an AP class this semester - your student's AP Classroom was updated with the AP exams they are enrolled in and scheduled to take in May. More information on registration and payment for this AP exam is to come.

Under the guidance of their AP teacher, your student has been asked to log in to their AP Classroom to ensure that the exams they are registered for are correct. **Please take a moment with your student this week to also log into their AP Classroom with them to ensure that their AP exams are listed correctly on their dashboard.**

You can do so by having your student log on to their AP Classroom and following the steps below...

1. Ask your student to log on to their AP classroom at myap.collegeboard.org.
2. Under the blue "AP Classroom" header, confirm that each AP class your student is enrolled in has an exam date showcased in

the right column. If you do not see this for an exam you know you paid for/your student plans to take, please contact dlensen@holyfamilydbq.org right away.

Upcoming ACT Exam Opportunities

National and District ACT exam dates are coming up this winter and spring. National exams happen on Saturday mornings throughout the state, and district exams happen on Wahlert's campus during the school day (specifically for our students). Below are a few upcoming options.

- **The next national ACT exam will take place on Saturday, February 6.** Wahlert is **not** hosting this exam, so more information on how to register online and which Eastern Iowa testing centers are available can be found on act.org. Payment and registration for this particular exam is done completely online at act.org. Deadline to register for this exam is January 8th (late registration deadline for this exam is January 15).
- **Wahlert will be hosting a national ACT exam on Saturday, April 17.** This exam will be hosted at Wahlert the morning of April 17. Payment and registration for this particular exam is done completely online at act.org. Deadline to register for this exam is March 12 (late registration deadline for this exam is March 26).

- **Wahlert will be hosting a district ACT exam on Tuesday, March 2, for our junior class.** Wahlert is hosting this exam for our juniors during the school day/on our campus. Payment and registration for this exam is **not** done online, since it is Wahlert's own district exam - payment is submitted via your family's **online Holy Family eFunds account**. More communication on registration deadlines, exam cost/eFunds, exam day details, etc. will be communicated to families and students via email and Wahlert's newsletter at the start of 2nd semester.

High School Summer Artificial Intelligence Program

Online summer AI program opportunity organized by Stanford PhD students.

AI Scholars Live Online is a 10-session (25 hours) pre-college enrichment program that exposes high school students (Grades 9-12) to fundamental AI concepts and guides them to build a socially impactful project. Taught by a **team** of graduate students from Stanford University, students receive a personalized, interdisciplinary learning experience with a student-teacher ratio of 4:1. Students with prior programming experience are placed in an advanced cohort. Multiple dates and times for their Summer Break and Spring Semester programs are offered. Students may apply **here**. Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) Available October 1

The beginning of October marks the time period that parents should be thinking about and working on the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). This form is used to apply for federal student aid such as loans, grants, and work-study at both two-year colleges as well as four-year colleges. The FAFSA is the first step to receiving financial aid and must be completed for each year of college. Students can use the myStudentAid app, file online at fafsa.edu.gov, or request a printed form by calling 1-800-4-FEDAID. This form is very important for you and your child to complete together so that your child is able to receive student financial assistance.
