Wahlert Counseling News Corner:

ACT Student Code Distribution | Tuesday, February 23

Is your student registered for the March 2nd ACT exam at Wahlert Catholic High School?

Sophomore, junior, and senior students (and their parents) received an email on Friday, February 19th, regarding the <u>required</u> steps registered examinees need in order to complete ACT's non-test sections prior to exam day.

The non-test portion of the ACT exam is required to be completed by your student prior to the March 2nd exam. This session is separate from the ACT exam itself, so that on exam day students can focus entirely on the exam. In the non-test portion, students must provide important demographic details, high school course resume, college plans, and score recipient information. This is all done online using your student's MyACT account (myact.org), as well as their student code information.

On Tuesday, February 23, students registered for the March 2nd exam are to report to the Wahlert gymnasium during Eagle Time to receive their student code information for the ACT exam. Students will then use this information to complete the non-test portion of the exam PRIOR TO the ACT exam happening on March 2nd. Additional details regarding how to complete the non-test portion of the ACT at home, including this short how-to video, can be found in the email sent to students and parents on Friday, February 19. If your student is virtual, please email dlensen@holyfamilydbq.org immediately for your student's code information.

Your student is to treat this non-test portion of the exam with the same importance as the March 2nd ACT exam day. We ask that parents please

remind their student(s) how important these steps are for the upcoming ACT exam.

Registration Open | ACT District Exam, March 2

In an effort to ensure that our sophomores, juniors, and seniors have an opportunity to take the ACT exam this academic year, Wahlert is now a district testing site for the spring ACT exam (with writing). This means that Wahlert will administer the ACT exam (with writing) during the school day at Wahlert on Tuesday, March 2, for our sophomores, juniors, and seniors who are interested in and registered for this particular exam. Additional details regarding what to expect on test day will be communicated to parents and students in the upcoming weeks.

PLEASE NOTE...

- Payment for the March 2nd ACT exam **must** be submitted (either via eFunds or by check) no later than Monday, February 22.
- Payments after Monday, February 22, will <u>not</u> be accepted as Wahlert's Counseling Office will be working with registered students to complete portions of the non-test sections in the week leading up to exam day.
- If you have issues with submitting a payment via eFunds, please contact dlensen@holyfamilydbq.org as soon as possible.
 Otherwise, please submit payment by check to Wahlert's Counseling Office by the February 22nd deadline.

Spring ACT District Exam

Exam Day: Tuesday, March 2

Cost: \$59.50 per student

Registration Deadline: Monday, February 22

Who can take the exam? This exam is available to our sophomores, juniors,

and seniors. (If you have questions about if your sophomore should take the ACT exam in March, please contact our school counselors at klenart@holyfamilydbq.org or dbuddebandy@holyfamilydbq.org.

- Registration for the March 2nd ACT exam at Wahlert is <u>not</u> completed on ACT's website.
 - Students are to submit their exam payment using their family's online Holy Family eFunds account by February 22nd to register. **Click here** to log in to your eFunds account, select or add your student, select "Pay for Optional Fees", and select "ACT March 2, 2021" to submit payment. **Click here** for a step-by-step guide to using e-Funds if this is a new program for your family.
- Families may submit payment via check if they prefer not to submit payment online.
 - Checks may be made payable to Wahlert Catholic High School; please indicate in the memo portion of the check your student's name and if they plan to take the writing portion of the exam on March 2).
- Wahlert is only offering the ACT exam with writing for the March district exam. Students are encouraged to participate in writing portion of the exam; however, this is portion of the exam is optional.
 - <u>IMPORTANT</u>: Parents/students are to indicate in the field provided on eFunds if their student plans to take/not take the writing portion of the exam. If your family is paying for this exam by check, please indicate this in the memo portion along with your student's name.
- We have reserved enough exams for our students to take on March 2nd, so students do not need to worry about registration being a first-come-first-serve basis. However, payment is due no later than Monday, February 22, to the Guidance Office as we try to limit classroom sizes due to COVID-19.

ACT Test Prep Seminar | February 11-24

Students who registered for the ZAPS ACT Test Prep Seminar, happening February 11th-24th at Wahlert, were recently emailed their classroom assignments and Zoom link information. Students are to report to their assigned classroom at the start of Mentor Hour (9:00 a.m.) each school day starting on February 11th. Virtual students are to log on at 9:00 a.m. from home using the Zoom link information sent to them.

Should we experience any weather-related school delays/cancellations between February 11th and February 24th, students registered for the seminar will follow the schedule below:

If we have a <u>two hour delay</u> any day between February 11th - 24th, we would start the ZAPS prep session an hour earlier. Instead of starting at 9:00am from school, students would be responsible to connect via Zoom from 8:00-8:40am from home. Students were emailed the Zoom link on Tuesday, February 9th.

If school is <u>cancelled</u> any day between February 11th-24th, students would still be required to connect that day via Zoom from 9-9:40am from home. Students were emailed the Zoom link on Tuesday, February 9th.

On February 17th, Ash Wednesday, the ZAPS prep session will run from 8:40 a.m. - 9:30 a.m. Students will then attend Ash Wednesday service at 9:35 a.m.

Double-check Your Student's AP Exam Order through AP Classroom

If you are a parent of a Wahlert student currently enrolled in an AP class this semester - your student's AP Classroom was updated with the AP exams they are enrolled in and scheduled to take in May. More information on registration and payment for this AP exam is to come.

Under the guidance of their AP teacher, your student has been asked to log in to their AP Classroom to ensure that the exams they are registered for are correct. Please take a moment with your student this week to also log into their AP Classroom with them to ensure that their AP exams are listed correctly on their dashboard.

You can do so by having your student log on to their AP Classroom and following the steps below...

- 1. Ask your student to log on to their AP classroom at **myap.collegeboard.org**.
- 2. Under the blue "AP Classroom" header, confirm that each AP class your student is enrolled in has an exam date showcased in

the right column. If you do not see this for an exam you know you paid for/your student plans to take, please contact **dlensen@holyfamilydbq.org**right away.

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Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) Available October 1

The beginning of October marks the time period that parents should be thinking about and working on the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). This form is used to apply for federal student aid such as loans, grants, and work-study at both two-year colleges as well as four-year colleges. The FAFSA is the first step to receiving financial aid and must be completed for each year of college. Students can use the myStudentAid app, file online at **fafsa.edu.gov**, or request a printed form by calling 1-800-4-FEDAID. This form is very important for you and your child to complete together so that your child is able to receive student financial assistance.
