## ISASP Testing | Wahlert Catholic High School

**Exam dates:** April 6-7 | 7:40 a.m.-10:30 a.m.

**Exam location:** Wahlert Catholic High School

**Students testing:** 9th-11th grade

Starting on Tuesday, April 6, Wahlert's 9th-11th grade students will complete ISASP testing in reading, writing, and math subjects (10th grade will also complete a science exam, later in the week). Your 9th-11th grader(s) are required to report to campus no later than 7:40am to complete their required ISASP exams. Testing will take place from 7:40 a.m. - 10:30 a.m. each exam day. Please also remind your student to arrive at school with a fully charged Chromebook on exam days.

Seniors are required to attend CPR training, starting at 9:30 a.m., on the dates listed below. Regular classes for Grades 9-12 will begin at 10:30 a.m. on April 6th and 7th.

## Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) Available October 1

The beginning of October marks the time period that parents should be thinking about and working on the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). This form is used to apply for federal student aid such as loans, grants, and work-study at both two-year colleges as well as four-year colleges. The FAFSA is the first step to receiving financial aid and must be completed for each year of college. Students can use the myStudentAid app,

file online at [fafsa.edu.gov](https://fafsa.edu.gov), or request a printed form by calling 1-800-4-FEDAID. This form is very important for you and your child to complete together so that your child is able to receive student financial assistance.
