## Class of 2021 | Scholarship Information Deadline, May 7

Each year during Wahlert's senior assembly event, up to three scholarships are announced for every senior. These scholarships will be printed in the graduation program, as well.

Senior parents are to complete this Scholarship & Transcript Request Google form by Friday, May 7, to submit the three scholarships and/or awards they would like shared at the Senior Assembly and printed in the graduation program for their senior.

This Google form will also ask parents which college or university Wahlert Catholic High School is to send their graduating senior's final transcript to in early June. Students who took a college course through any college/university during their time at Wahlert Catholic High School (College Writing, Statistics, Public Speaking, etc.) are required to contact the appropriate college/university's registrar office directly to have their college credits transferred to the college/university they are attending next school year. *This is the responsibility of the student, as Wahlert Catholic High*  School is unable to transfer college credits to a student's college or university.

#### Parents must complete this online form no later than Friday, May 7.

**If notification is received later than Friday, May 7,** students risk not having their scholarships or awards printed in the graduation program or announced at the assembly, in addition to a delayed final transcript sent to their college/university.

If your student happens to receive an additional scholarship after you have submitted this form by the May 7th deadline - please reach out to the Counseling Department (dlensen@holyfamilydbq.org) as soon as possible if you have changes that need made to the scholarships you requested to be shared.

## College Credit & Transcript Requests | College Courses

**Do you have a senior who took a college course through Northeast Iowa Community College (NICC) or another area college/university?** Read below for information on how to request their college course transcript to be transferred to the school they are attending next fall.

#### **Requesting Transcripts Electronically from NICC**

(Please contact NICC's Registrar Office with any questions at (844) 642-2338, ext. 2217.)

- Students may access an <u>unofficial transcript</u> from NICC as a record of coursework prior to the completion of spring courses. Students may do this by accessing the "NICC Self-Service for Students" task on their MyCampus portal, and locating the "Unofficial Transcript" link under the "Academics" menu on the left side of the webpage.
- Students can request an <u>official transcript</u> from their NICC MyCampus portal by searching for "Transcript Request." If requesting a transcript prior to the completion of spring courses, students should select "Yes" when MyCampus

asks, "Are you currently enrolled?". Official transcripts will be sent out as soon as possible after final grades are submitted. There is a \$5 fee to have this transcript sent.

 Please note that requesting college transcripts is the responsibility of the student, as Wahlert Catholic High School is unable to transfer college credits to a student's college or university.

#### **Requesting Transcripts from an area College or University**

(Loras College, University of Dubuque, Clarke University, etc.)

- Students who took a college course through any college/university during their time at Wahlert Catholic High School (College Writing, Statistics, Public Speaking, etc.) are required to contact the appropriate college/university's registrar office directly to have their college credits transferred to the college/university they are attending next school year.
- Please note that requesting college transcripts is the responsibility of the student, as Wahlert Catholic High School is unable to transfer college credits to a student's college or university.



## Advanced Placement (AP) Exam Weeks | Spring 2021

It's hard to believe that we are nearly rounding the corner to May! With that comes Advanced Placement (AP) testing for your AP student who ordered an exam earlier this fall.

#### AP Exam Week | Spring 2021

Wahlert Catholic High School's Counseling Office wanted to reach out to you regarding this year's AP exam schedule. AP exams will take place here on campus during the week of May 3 - May 7 as well as May 10 - May 12, May 14, and May 17.

#### Exam Attendance

This year, we are allowing students the option to be excused from classes before or after their AP exam. This is to give them an opportunity to solely focus on their AP exam. We know taking high stake exams can be stressful, which is why we are giving parents the option to allow their student to be excused from other courses on their exam day. Completing the permission form linked below gives your student permission to be excused from morning or afternoon classes. It is your student's responsibility to be at school on time for their AP exam(s).

- This completed permission form must be turned in to Wahlert's main office prior to your student's exam.
- Students are to report to their exam classroom at the designated exam time.
- We are encouraging all students to attend any AP classes still needed to prepare for future exams.

*Keep in mind*... Once the AP exam has started, students will no longer be permitted into their testing room, per AP guidelines, if they arrive late. Please encourage your student to arrive at school early on the day of their AP exam.

#### Does your student have a schedule conflict with their AP exam date?

College Board allows students to reschedule an AP exam for a later date if it is for a reason approved by College Board (athletic event, academic contest, etc.). If your student is unable to test on their originally scheduled AP exam date, please contact Danielle Lensen as soon as

possible (**dlensen@holyfamilydbq.org**). Our office will then look into if your student qualifies for a later exam date option. Failure to let Wahlert's Counseling Office know at least a week before your student's AP exam(s) will result in your student not being able to reschedule their exam.

## Gateway Summer Program | The University of Iowa

**The University of Iowa's Gateway Program** is a free summer experience designed to increase understanding of business majors for high school juniors from backgrounds underrepresented in business. Get a sense of what you can do with a business degree. Most importantly, you will get a head start on transitioning from high school to college.

## Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) Available October 1

The beginning of October marks the time period that parents should be thinking about and working on the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). This form is used to apply for federal student aid such as loans, grants, and work-study at both two-year colleges as well as four-year colleges. The FAFSA is the first step to receiving financial aid and must be completed for each year of college. Students can use the myStudentAid app, file online at **fafsa.edu.gov**, or request a printed form by calling 1-800-4-FEDAID. This form is very important for you and your child to complete together so that your child is able to receive student financial assistance.
